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BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST TWO CONTRACTORS

(Reno, NV) – At its meeting on May 6, 2003 the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against two (2) licensed contractors.

Summary Suspension

Sierrasage LLC., license number 52571 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Sparks, Nevada was summarily suspended by the Nevada State Contractors Board.

The Board acted under a provision of the Nevada revised Statutes (NRS) 624.291, which gives the Board authority to suspend the license of a contractor without a hearing if the board finds, based upon evidence in its possession, that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires summary suspension of the license.

All Seasons Concrete, license number 40313 (Concrete Contracting) based out of Reno, NV was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; bidding in excess of established monetary limit; failure to provide required disclosures; a fraudulent or deceitful act; and failure to obtain proper lien releases. The Board revoked the license of All Seasons Concrete.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

The Board will convene next in Henderson, NV on May20, 2003.
