## SOUTHERN NEVADA CONTRACTOR DISCIPLINED BY CONTRACTORS BOARD

(*Henderson, NV*) – At its meeting on June 19, 2008, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated a case involving one Southern Nevada contractor.

A Design Center, dba A Remodeling Center, license numbers 68016 and 69447 (Install Terazzo & Marble and Carpentry), based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to take appropriate corrective action; failure to include the Residential Recovery Fund information on a contract or proposal; failure to include the monetary license limit and license number on a contract or proposal; failure to provide the name, license number, business address and telephone number of all subcontractors on the project; willful disregard of the building laws of the state; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The licensee was fined \$2,650, ordered to pay investigative costs, pay \$15,000 restitution to the homeowner and make full restitution to all damaged parties and reimburse the Board for any monies paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund, plus fines and investigative costs prior to consideration of future licensure. The licenses were revoked.

\*\*The Business Review Program is one in which a contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
