<u>NSCB Investigators Cite Three Contractors</u> <u>In Reno For Alleged Unlicensed Activity</u>

Nevada State Contractors Board investigators conducted a sting operation recently in the Reno area for alleged unlicensed contracting activity.

Those who received citations for allegedly *contracting without a license* by submitting bids were:

Roberto Melendez, dba Eternal Carpeting, submitted a *bid for the installation of carpet at a business for \$10,440.00*, issued an administration citation; **Michael A. Fogal**, dba It's All Handy, submitted a *bid for painting labor for \$2,000.00*, issued an administration citation; and **Tom Dundas**, dba Sierra Home Repair, *submitted a bid for painting for \$2,759.00*, administration citation pending.

All three unlicensed contractors were advertising on a local Reno grocery store bulletin board. Homeowners are advised that unlicensed contractors frequently use these sources to solicit business. Contracting without a license in Nevada is a misdemeanor for the first offense, a gross misdemeanor for the second offense and a Class E felony for the third offense.

Homeowners who use unlicensed contractors are not eligible for the Residential Recovery Fund, and by law their contracts are null and void.

The NSCB recommends that homeowners not use unlicensed contractors because their work is generally poor quality, they are often uninsured and may not maintain workman's compensation coverage for their employees and the homeowner may be liable for all injuries to workers.
