FOUR NEVADA CONTRACTORS DISCIPLINED BY CONTRACTORS BOARD

(*Reno, NV*) – At its meeting on June 10, 2009, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases involving four contractors.

Michael Ray Yount, dba Yount Construction, license number 23047 (Residential & Small Commercial) based out of Reno, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to comply with a written citation. The licensee was fined \$775 and a letter of reprimand was placed in the company file.

Mark Huber Construction, Inc., license number 58922 (Residential & Small Commercial) based out of Park City, Utah, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to establish financial responsibility and failure to comply with a written request from the Board. The licensee was fined \$750 and ordered to pay investigative costs. The license was revoked.

Alee Enterprises, Inc., dba B Daniel Door & Hardware, license number 54945 (Carpentry), based out of Sparks, NV, and Alee Enterprises, dba Robert A. Wheeler Construction Co, license number 30778A (Residential & Small Commercial) based out of Reno, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to respond to a written request from the Board; failure to comply with a written request from the Board; failure to keep in force a bond or cash deposit; failure to establish financial responsibility; and for the partnership, corporation, firm or association participating in a prohibited act. The licensee was fined \$800, ordered to pay investigative costs and provide a current financial statement. License number 54945 was revoked.

Baylocq Construction, Inc., license number 47611 (Residential & Small Commercial) based out of Reno, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to keep in force a bond or cash deposit; and failure to comply with a written request from the Board. The licensee was ordered to pay investigative costs; pay Unlimited Concrete \$24,650 in full; and provide a bond and current financial statement. The license was suspended.

**The Business Review Program is one in which a contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's licensee. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
