## <u>Unlicensed Contractor Defrauds</u> <u>Homeowners and Contractors</u>

Bills Paving Designs, license number 39930, based out of Reno, NV, was revoked on Oct. 9, 2008, for failure to comply with the terms of a construction contract, not responding to written requests from the Board and failure to establish financial responsibility.

As an unlicensed contractor, William H. Lagorio, dba Bills Paving Designs, entered into a contract with a homeowner for the installation of paver stones in the amount of \$5,200. After the homeowner paid Lagorio, he failed to pay the material supplier \$2,667.46.

Lagorio entered into a second contract with another homeowner for the installation of pavers in the amount of \$60,616.30. The homeowner paid Lagorio \$30,000. Again, he failed to pay the material supplier, resulting in a lien being placed against the homeowner for \$25,615.50. The homeowner subsequently paid the material supplier to have the lien released.

On a complaint filed by a homeowner with the Board, Lagorio pled guilty to felony diversion of funds in Reno District Court Department 8 in May 2009. He was given a suspended prison sentence, fined \$5,000 and placed on probation and ordered to pay Washoe County investigative costs and \$36,177.34 in restitution to the homeowner. Lagorio's probation officer is currently working with the court to arrange payments on this plea.

Lagorio recently pled guilty in Reno Justice Court to *contracting without a license* on a misdemeanor warrant for failure to pay a \$635 fine and investigative costs stemming from a sting conducted by the Board. Lagorio had provided a \$9,200 bid to an undercover NSCB criminal investigator for the installation of pavers. He has been ordered by the court to pay \$100 a month until the fine is paid.

"It is important for consumers to check the license status of any company they wish to hire at our website: www.nscb.state.nv.us," Margi Grein, Executive Officer of the NSCB, says. "Enforcement stings like this, on revoked licensees, are conducted by NSCB investigators on a continuous basis and help rid our neighborhoods of unscrupulous contractors."

The Board recommends that consumers limit a down payment to 10 percent of the total cost, don't let payments get ahead of the work, and don't pay in cash without obtaining signed receipts.
