

## NEVADA STATE CONTRACTORS BOARD NEWS RELEASE

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## CONTRACTORS BOARD ASSESSES \$6,400 IN FINES DURING DECEMBER DISCIPLINARY HEARINGS

**RENO and HENDERSON, Nev.** – The Nevada State Contractors Board took disciplinary action against licensed contractors for violations of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 624 during its December hearings. To comply with social distancing and related emergency directives, all Board hearings are conducted online via Zoom, in compliance with Open Meeting Law requirements.

Monetary limit reduced to \$10,000; licensee has 30 days to submit a compliant financial statement or the license shall be suspended.
Las Vegas Pools & Spas, LLC	82584 (A-10 Commercial and Residential Pools)	Found in violation of:  NRS 624.3013(5) Failure to comply with the provisions of this chapter or regulations of the Board  NRS 624.3016(5) Failure to comply with laws governing residential pool and spa contracts  Fined \$550 and assessed investigative costs.
D W Landscape, Inc.	License No. 52617 (C-10 Landscape Contracting)	Found in violation of:  NRS 624.3015(1) Acting beyond the scope of the license  Fined \$250 and assessed investigative costs. Monetary limit reduced to \$10,000; reduction does not apply to any project under construction at the time of the Decision and Order.
Vegas Fabulous Finishes	Unlicensed	Found in violation of:  NRS 624.720(1) Unlawful advertising Fined \$1,000 and assessed investigative costs.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

NRS 624.212(7) allows an unlicensed individual who was issued a cease and desist order to petition the Board in writing to lift or alter the order within 15 days after receiving the cease and desist order. Upon receipt of this request, the Board will schedule an administrative hearing to review the facts and make a determination on the validity of the cease and desist order and assess any fines or costs that may be associated with the investigation.

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
