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CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES ACTION ON THREE CASES DURING DECEMBER 2022 DISCIPLINARY HEARINGS

LAS VEGAS and RENO, NEV. – The Nevada State Contractors Board took disciplinary action against three licensed contractors for violations of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 624 including suspending one license during its December hearings. All Board hearings were conducted in compliance with Nevada Open Meeting Law requirements.

Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

The NSCB has the responsibility to promote quality construction by Nevada licensed contractors through a regulatory licensing system designed to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public.
