**CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION
AGAINST THREE CONTRACTORS**

(Reno, NV) - At its meeting on July 6, 2005, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against three (3) licensed contractors.

Summit Homes, license number 47992 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Gardnerville, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship, failure to notify an owner of the Recovery Fund, and failure to include disclosures required by a general building contractor. The licensee was fined \$2,000 and assessed the cost of investigations. The Respondent was also issued a corrective order to correct workmanship issues.

Nevada Heating, Air Conditioning and Plumbing, Inc., license number 34910A (Refrigeration and Air Conditioning) based out of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to include a license number in advertisements. The licensee was fined \$500, and ordered to submit to a Business Review.*

C P S Concrete, license number 42563 (Concrete Contracting) and 43793 (Landscape Contracting) based out of Reno was found guilty of 2 violations of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for Workmanship, failure to comply with a written request from the Board, failure to include required Recovery Fund disclosures, failure to comply with the terms of a contract or written warranty, acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license, and failure to include license number or monetary limit on a contract or proposal. The licensee was fined \$1,000 and assessed the cost of investigations, ordered to make restitution to the homeowners and submit to a Business Review.* Both license numbers were placed on probation.

*The Business Review Program is one in which a contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
