## TWO LICENSES REVOKED; \$29,350 ASSESSED IN FINES AT JUNE DISCIPLINARY HEARING

**HENDERSON, Nev.** – The Nevada State Contractors Board disciplined three licensed contractors for violations of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 624 during its June hearing.

**Alerra Construction, Inc.**, license number 73103 (plumbing and heating) based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for abandonment without legal excuse of any construction project, failure to establish financial responsibility, advertising projects of construction beyond the scope of the license, failure to include Residential Recovery Fund information in a contract, contracting beyond the scope of the license, substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, failure to comply with a written request from the Board, failure to provide the name, license number, business address and telephone number of all subcontractors and persons who furnish material of \$500 or more for the project, and failure to provide a pre-lien notice to the owner. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$15,000, assessed investigative costs and ordered to pay restitution.

**Triple R Construction, LLC,** license numbers 74770 (residential and small commercial) and 75394 (electrical) based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for failure to comply with a written request from the Board. Licensee surrendered license number 75394. License number 74770 was suspended pending review of a financial statement and receipt and approval of a change of officer application. Licensee was fined \$350 and assessed investigative costs.

**Quality Electric & Solar, LLC, dba QES** license number 75694 (electrical contracting) based out of Henderson, Nev., was found in violation for failure to comply with the terms of a contract thereby causing material injury to another, failure to take appropriate corrective action, abandonment without legal excuse of any construction project, failure to establish financial responsibility, failure to include the license number or limit on a bid or contract and failure to pay any money due for any materials or services rendered. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$14,000, assessed investigative costs and ordered to pay restitution.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
