"BORDER BLITZ" NABS FAKE CONTRACTORS IN NEVADA, CALIFORNIA

STATELINE – The Nevada State Contractors Board (NSCB) and California Contractors State License Board (CSLB) conducted their third concurrent undercover enforcement operation on April 30, citing 19 people for unlicensed contracting activity. The "Border Blitz" used homes in Stateline, Nev. and South Lake Tahoe, Calif.

Investigators from NSCB and CSLB's Statewide Investigative Fraud Team (SWIFT) posed as property owners and contacted unlicensed contractors, inviting them to visit the sting location to discuss performing landscaping, painting, drywall, plumbing, tile work, masonry and other construction trades that require contractors' licenses. Each agency sent investigators to observe the other's operation.

Suspects who offered to perform jobs that require contractors' licenses or who bid more than the legal limit for labor and materials received citations.

A registered sex offender was among those cited in Nevada. In all, Nevada investigators cited eight people for contracting without a license. Seven of the eight also were charged with illegal advertising. Of these, three hold valid California contractors' licenses. Defendants will be required to appear in Lake Tahoe Justice Court.

It is against the law in Nevada to contract for home improvement or construction jobs valued at \$1,000 or more for labor and materials without a state-issued contractor license. A license also is required to perform or advertise for electrical, plumbing, heating, air conditioning or any other life-safety trade in Nevada, regardless of the project's value.

CSLB cited 11 suspects for contracting without a license; nine face additional charges of illegal advertising. Defendants will answer the charges in El Dorado County, Calif. courtrooms. California requires licensure for any project valued at \$500 or more. While unlicensed persons may advertise for and perform jobs valued at less than \$500, advertisements must identify the person or company as unlicensed.

The El Dorado County District Attorney's Office provided law enforcement backup at the California sting site.

"Unlicensed activity continues to deprive legitimate contractors of jobs and to put property owners' safety and financial well being at risk," said NSCB Executive Officer Margi A. Grein. "Nevada and California have demonstrated a firm commitment to protecting our citizens from the risks presented by unlicensed contractors who often carry no insurance, are not bonded and have not demonstrated competence in the work they perform."

California and Nevada have a reciprocity agreement that simplifies the application process for contractors licensed in one state who want to seek a license in the other. Investigators urged those cited to begin the licensing process in states in which they perform work.

NSCB and CSLB urge consumers to follow these tips before signing a contract for home improvement work:

- Only hire licensed contractors who hold a valid license in the state where the job will be done and in the classification of the work to be undertaken.
- Always check the license number on <u>NCSB</u>'s of <u>CSLB</u>'s website to make sure the contractor's license is in good standing.

- Don't pay in cash, and don't let payments get ahead of the work.
- Get at least three bids, check references, and get a written contract.
- Do not sign a contract until you completely understand all its terms.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes,

licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

The Contractors State License Board operates under the umbrella of the California Department of Consumer Affairs. More information and publications about hiring contractors are available on the CSLB website or by calling 800-321-CSLB (2752). You can also sign up for CSLB email alerts. CSLB licenses and regulates California's 300,000 contractors, and is regarded as one of the leading consumer protection agencies in the United States. In fiscal year 2010-11, CSLB helped recover nearly \$45 million in ordered restitution for consumers.
