Nevada State Contractors Board Revokes Titan Solar Company's License

Titan Solar fined \$400,000 and deemed a serious public health threat

LAS VEGAS and RENO, NEV. – On July 16, 2024, a Nevada State Contractors Board Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) revoked the contractor's license of Titan Solar Company during a formal Disciplinary Hearing and ruled that it represents a serious public threat. "I am going to find that Titan Solar Company caused significant harm, and constitutes a serious threat to the public's health, safety, and welfare," said ALJ Richard Scotti.

The judge also imposed a \$400,000 fine after ruling that Titan Solar was guilty on 70 counts of violating Nevada law and causing harm to 29 homeowners. The guilty charges include:

- Diligence (Failing to complete a project in a timely manner.)
- Substandard workmanship issues.
- Failing to comply with a notice to correct.
- Performing work beyond the scope of their license.
- Working with an unlicensed contractor.

"Having a contractor's license in the State of Nevada is based on the integrity and acknowledgement of a company's officers to adhere to the laws and standards of the construction industry," said NSCB Executive Officer Margi Grein. "Titan Solar has proven to be incapable of fulfilling its responsibilities resulting in significant harm to consumers who placed their trust and resources in them. The Board's focus now is guiding homeowners to the Residential Recovery Fund to identify opportunities for financial recourse."

All contractors in Nevada must be licensed by the Nevada State Contractors Board. The Board reminds homeowners to hire only licensed contractors to receive its full protections which include:

- Four years to file a complaint.
- Full investigative services of the Board.
- Could be eligible for up to \$40,000 from the Board's [Residential Recovery Fund](#).
